Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

As we enter Holy Week this year, I have the impression that there is a deeper need for these pensive, reflective and soul-stripping days before us than ever. Our world is torn by violence, our nation is laden with lives that are struggling — some for day-to-day survival and some for inane acquisition and all for a way to make sense of the tailspin that civility and baseline respect has taken in our culture. Our communities and lives seem utterly void of holy purpose and hope. Into such a cauldron, a Messiah audaciously enters.

The same as always, Jesus plunges into our messed up realities and topsy-turvy priorities. With no thought for how we might reject him, he strips himself of pride and pretense, and dons a towel to wash our feet on Maundy Thursday. Bending low and grabbing hold of the part of our bodies that are most telling about how we live — our feet that take us to worship and to work and to play — Jesus sanctifies our feet and in the moment, hallows all our lives as his followers. We share the meal and know what comes next: betrayal and denial, and all manner of isolation and desertion — not on His part — but ours.

The next day — the worst day that is oddly called Good Friday — based on the outcome and not on the quality of that day for sure — it is the day of sobriety calling us to see if we have what it takes to meet him at the cross. Not even to go to the cross ourselves, but just to be there. To stand. To sit. To listen to the words spoken and sung. To pray. To tolerate the cost of our abundant life...his dying. Can you be there? Will you be there? At the cross?

Saturday always stands as a day of curious empty time. The grief of loss — the poignant reality of what we can do to God in our worst moments — the grief of awareness and facing ourselves. Facing God. Holding hope back with one hand (for we do know how the story ends), if we really want to be captured by the wave of joy that Easter can bring, we must allow the barrenness of hope-lost to descend to the pit of our soul: to be engulfed in the horror of dreams smashed to smithereens as the first disciples must have been. Aware of Peter's lost chance to claim kinship to the Master in the courtyard, we recount the time upon time we too have swallowed our testimony...slunk back from a chance to be hands and feet that made a life-giving difference.

What we do - or don't do - in this Holy Week will quite possibly allow the joy of Easter to catapult into our souls with a brilliance and earth-shaking impact - whether we approach the resurrection on Sabbath Eve at 5:30pm — when four of our young people are celebrating the Holy Sacrament of Baptism and making claim to their relationship with the Christ - or at Sonrise, when the garden is dark and the air is heavy and the plaintiff tones of "Were You There?" bring us back there and then, only to be ushered into the daylight of His Easter Love slowly and gently. Whether you eat breakfast before or after you hear the trumpets and the bells and the jubilant songs of joy, whether you help find Easter eggs or color a picture with one of the youngsters in the Narthex and no matter how many hydrangeas and Easter Lilies you load into the car to carry home or to neighbors needing a physical reminder of Jesus' love, I pray the resonance of your voice calling out, "Christ is Risen Indeed" this Easter will swell your heart with love and peace and joy and perfect hope.

For we know. We know. We know that regardless of the state of our world and nation and communities, God's got this. God is about to do something that will upend our lives and cause us to shake our head in wonder and amazement. God is about to rend the heavens and renew the life of the world this Resurrection Sunday! God is about to do what we could never begin to imagine doing on our own: healing this world and building bridges across party lines and serving up holy purpose and hope on our Easter Breakfast plates!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed — Alleluia!

Dear Friends,

Did you know that every Tuesday morning the kids at our Tree of Life Preschool come into our sanctuary for chapel? They spend about 15 minutes singing songs like "This Little Light of Mine," listening to stories based on the Bible, and saying simple prayers. There are other fun activities, too. Let me tell you what we did

during chapel on one recent Tuesday.

First, we admired a picture showing Jesus carrying a sheep over his shoulders. After agreeing that sheep are adorable and sweet, we talked about how Jesus is the Good Shepherd (John 10:11-18) who takes care of us just like a shepherd takes care of the sheep.

Next, the kids learned that if one sheep happens to wander away and get lost, the good shepherd will go searching and never stop until that sheep gets rescued (Luke 15:3-7). Then I told the kids that I had hidden five pictures of sheep in various places around the sanctuary, and they could help find them. They did a great job of hunting for the sheep and bringing them back into the fold safe and sound. Super fun! The kids always have a good time, and I enjoy watching them grow spiritually every week.

Did you know that Trinity folks are always welcome to come to chapel with the kids? It starts Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. You can sit with the kids and participate in the songs and prayer, or even help with the activities. You can contact me for more information or just drop by on Tuesday morning.
