Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

Most likely, you will be reading this during the "Twelve Days of Christmas", so I am safe to draw on the images and themes of this potent and life-changing season. Upon the birth of Christ depends the very presence of God's love in our world — and our hearts, indi-

vidually and collectively!

Of all the Christmas Carols, this year the one that has held my attention and commanded my reflection and I am struck by is "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear". Not often listed as part of the top ten favorites, this rather obscure carol has its origins in Boston, MA, with the text written by Edmund H. Sears. Perhaps you recognize it as the carol insistently focused on the angels' song at Jesus' birth.

From the outset, the carol weaves a majestic image of "angels bending near the earth to touch their harps of gold". You can see the picture in your mind's eye — dark blue sky, strewn with pinpoints of starlight and punctuated with heavenly beings bowing toward earth, singing and plucking harps..."Peace on the earth, good will to all, from heaven's all gracious king" is the message.

Oh, how that message needs a hearing in our day. It is as true in 2024 as it was in 1849, when Sears penned the text! No longer is the third stanza included in our hymnals for singing...in the Lutheran circles it was dropped with the printing of the 1978 green hymnal. Included here are the words I sang as a child in the 1952 red hymnal:

Yet with the woes of sin and strife, The world hath suffered long; Beneath the angel-strain have rolled, Two thousand years of wrong; And man, at war with man, hears not The love song which they bring: O hush the noise, ye men of strife, and hear the angels sing.

So I wonder if the verse got thrown out because it is hard to bring into modern language — or was it simply denial that even two thousand years of "progress" has not shaped our world to be able to hear the "love song" of the angels?

Indeed, we need again to hear the love song of the angels, "that glorious song of old". If you didn't have the chance to stop and listen for the angel's song yet this Christmas season, STOP NOW! Find a quiet place...take an hour of prayer time and meditate on this Christmas Carol, listening for the love song of the angels. Don't you suspect that if God's love is going to permeate God's world again, it can happen in these days, and in this moment, and through the attentiveness that we model for the world?

Dr. C. Michael Hawn, professor of sacred music at Perkins School of Theology, writes: *It is right that we should joyfully sing* "Hark! the herald angels sing" and "Joy to the world" each Christmas season. But always there are moments when we realize the message of peace has not yet been fully realized on earth. Then we sing "It came upon the midnight clear," and the power of the Incarnation and the message of the gospel touch us even more deeply.

God has snuck into our world once again this Christmas - slipping into human skin and making a tent in our neighborhood. Will this be the year that you cradle the gift of love, not just at Christmas, but all year long? Will you intentionally join a book study to grow in faith with others? (Check out Pastor Kerri's book study on Rachel Held Evans' book: Inspired). Or maybe you want a unique way to start the year with a 31 day Bible reading and prayer plan. (Pick up a copy of "Bible Reading Plan: Choose You Own Journey" in the Narthex, or email the church to have the PDF sent to your email!) Whatever intentional steps of faith empowerment you take, may you indeed hear the love song the angels bring!

Dear Friends,

Mental health! That's the local justice issue STREAM will tackle next. It makes sense that, as followers of Jesus, we should care about mental health. Jesus once met a man who was thought to be possessed by demons (Luke 8:26-39). He lived among tombs, ran around naked, and broke the chains that were used to

restrain him. Today, we would describe the man as suffering from mental illness. Jesus compassionately healed him and restored him to his community.

Mental health issues can take many forms, and they vary in severity. Studies show that more than one in five adults and youth are dealing with some kind of mental health issue, which in turn can affect relationships, academic performance, job stability and productivity, and physical health. And for some folks, it's especially difficult to get treatment.

Mental health was the number one issue that was raised in Trinity's STREAM house meetings this fall. Here are some specific concerns:

Are there competent professionals and effective programs in our area to help folks across different age groups with the various difficulties they're dealing with? (For example, suicide/self-harm, anxiety, depression, PTSD, addiction, cognitive decline.)

Are the resources in our area affordable?

Are people aware of the resources that exist?

- Can clients get appointments in a reasonably short time?
- Are there competent counselors in our schools? Relatedly, are LGBTQ kids safe in their schools and able to talk freely with their counselors if they want to?

Over the next few weeks, STREAM members will be doing research and identifying specific goals related to mental health that we can begin working toward.

STREAM is looking for stories about mental health care in Manatee County. Have you or someone you love struggled with mental health? If so, maybe you have a story to share about those experiences. Maybe you'd like to join a research team and help us decide how to go forward. And maybe you can add your voice to others from STREAM when we tell our elected officials that mental health is important to us. As always, let me know if you want more information.

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. round of beef or flank steak cut in ¹/₂ inch strips
- 3 tbsp. teriyaki sauce 4 tsp. olive oil, divided
- 2 tsp. cornstarch

2 yellow onion cut in thin strips 1 red bell pepper,1 green pepper cut in thin strips

1 tbsp Sriracha Sauce (optional)

Directions:

Combine teriyaki sauce, Sriracha, 2 teaspoons oil and the cornstarch in a large bowl.

Add the beef strips and marinate in refrigerator for 45 minutes. In a wok or sauté pan, stir fry bell peppers and onions in 2 teaspoons of oil for 3 minutes. Remove from pan.

Stir fry the beef strips (1/2 at a time) for 3 minutes. Return the vegetables to pan and cook until hot.

Serve over Quinoa, Garlic & Brown rice pilaf or favorite side.

Faith Formation Team Reforming!




